I helped installed rental equipment for weddings and events, such as tables, chairs, staging, dance floor, and structure tents, as well as table linens and catering equipment.

My job for the first half of employment was to operate our 26ft box trucks or flatbed trucks to and from job sites, and help with install/takedown.

For the latter half, I became the manager of our tent warehouse. It was my duty to pull, package, and load deliveries, as well as load, unload, process/inventory, and clean/repair all incoming equipment.

As I was the only worker in this warehouse for most of my employment, or only having a team of 1-2 more individuals, and because nobody worked in here prior to me (the tent install crew tried doing work in here when they weren't in the field), it was completely disorganized and out of order when I began.

By the end of my employment, the entire warehouse was orderly and organized. I found more efficient placing of certain tools and products, and implemented many different operating methods and processes that save time and raise efficiency, from how we process our returning equipment, package our loads, and clean our equipment, to where we set things to shorten walking time and how we secure loads with straps to improve safety

#### **Crew Leader**

I worked for Miller's Grand Events starting as a crewman, working my way to Warehouse Manager, then Co-Crew Leading and driving. (We had one guy who was the "crew Leader" because he had been there so long but leading the labor and training people and the brunt of the work was on me. He drove when he was at work but dropped to part time so we split the leading position.) We had to clean and maintain our rental equipment and tents, run deliveries and installs, load and unload customer orders, I maintained inventory as well. These were small to medium scale jobs. I had to plan our route as there were sometimes many jobs a day for one crew.

I made sure there was no expired product in either department, scanning the items out under correct protocols. Daily temperature logs were kept up with. Customer service was offered, as I had to offer assistance to every customer who passed by.
